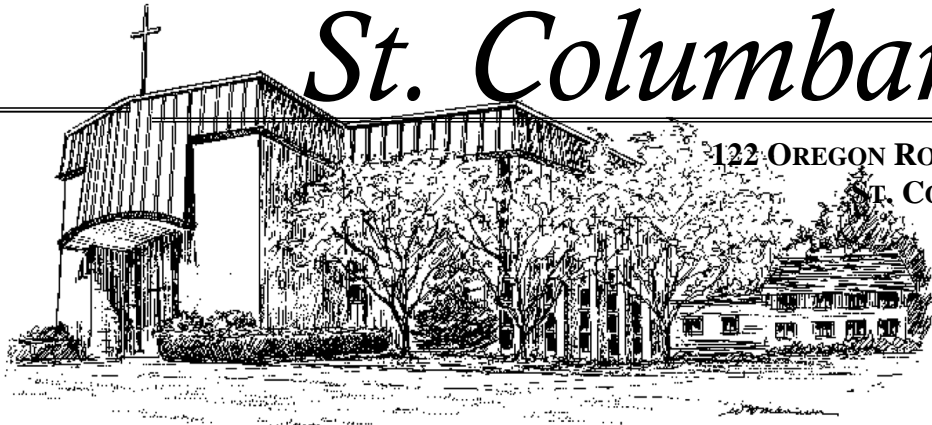

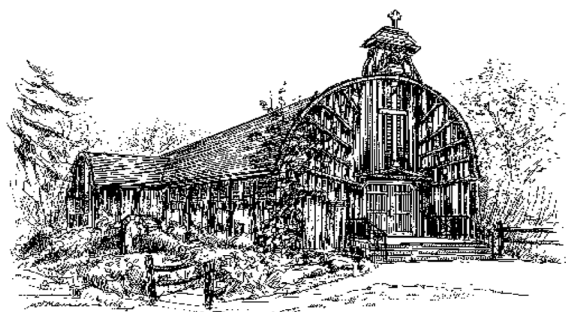

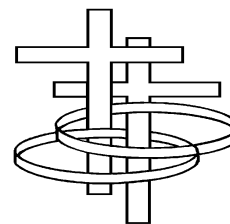

NOTES FROM OUR PASTOR . . .

*Today the Church celebrates Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In many places Eucharistic processions take place.

The Eucharist should be at the center of our life. Time and time again many converts to the Catholic Church recall a longing in their lives for something that was missing. Many would encounter a special feeling whenever they were near or in a Catholic Church. What they felt, what they longed for, was Jesus Christ, whose Real Presence exists on our altar at the consecration and in our tabernacles, where Jesus resides. On EWTN television (Cablevision channel 135) there is a show, "Catholics Come Home." It interviews those who come back or convert to the Catholic faith. The reason given most often is a desire for the Eucharist. We are reminded this Friday (Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus) how Jesus waits to pour out for us the graces flowing from His pierced heart. (Saturday we remember The Immaculate Heart of Mary, that Simeon prophesied would be pierced by the sorrow of her Son's death.)

If I were to take out ads offering a priceless gift to everyone who would come to Church on Sunday I'm sure our Church would be filled. Yet, every Sunday, on every altar, in every Catholic Church in the whole world, the precious gift of the Body of Christ is made present in an unending sacrifice offered to God the Father.
