NOTES FROM OUR PASTOR . . .

*Last Monday was the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, a 11 year old girl who was killed in 1902 for refusing the advances of an older boy. She was stabbed several times and died in the hospital after forgiving her attacker and praying for his conversion. Our youth group is dedicated to her and we pray that young people will practice the virtues of purity and chastity that are under attack in our sick and perverse culture.
