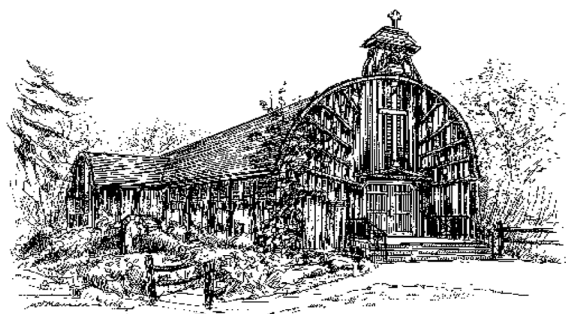

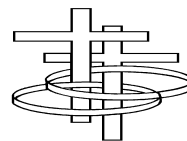

What we get out of it is not being entertained, but miraculously being united to Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. St. Paul wrote, "I live, no not I, but Christ lives in me." (Galatians 2:20). We have some young families that attend the Latin Mass at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday and follow along in the booklets and handouts of the Mass prayers that are provided. I hope that it helps to deepen their knowledge and love of the great gift of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. I know it has helped me to celebrate every Mass more reverently and prayerfully.
