



We have entered the joyful Easter season that lasts until Pentecost Sunday which is the commemoration of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles and our Lady fifty days--Pentecost means "50"--after Jesus arose from the dead. I would like to take this opportunity to *thank everyone* who worked so hard to make our church and the liturgy so dignified and beautiful. I hope that those who came to Mass on Easter will continue to attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass every Sunday and Holy Day. Please invite your friends and relatives to attend here or at their own parishes.

Mother Angelica, the Franciscan nun who founded the Catholic television and radio station EWTN (Eternal Word Television Network) died on Easter Sunday. She was courageous. Her only fear was that of not doing the will of God. Archbishop Chaput of Philadelphia said that Mother Angelica did what the U.S. Bishops couldn't do in establishing a successful Catholic network broadcasting to millions throughout the world. All Catholics should view this channel (135 on Cablevision) to learn and grow in their faith. I'm sure Mother will be canonized a saint someday. May she rest in peace.

Another nun, the Polish nun, Sister Faustina, in 1931 saw a vision of our Lord with red and white rays coming from His heart. These rays signified the mercy that flows from Jesus' heart. Pope ohn Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina and declared the Second Sunday of Easter (which we celebrate today), "Divine Mercy Sunday" as a reminder that the mercy of God, won for us by Jesus on the cross, is always available to us. All we need do is ask. We will have our Latin Mass with the Divine Mercy devotions today at 3:00PM, the time of our Lord's passion. Please join us in honoring our risen Lord and asking for His divine mercy.

May the Risen Christ continue to bless and provide for our parish and families.
