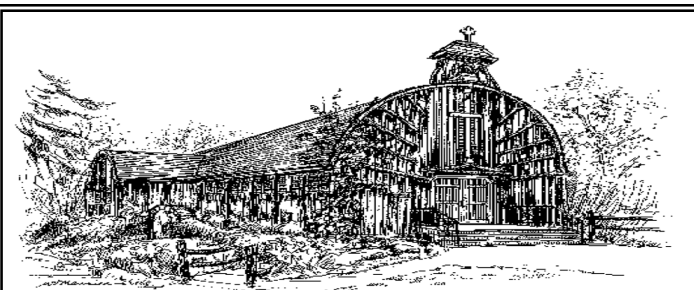

SPECIAL OPPORTUNITIES TO SERVE



Thanks to all who made our May Crowning such a beautiful event. Our First Communicants were a big part of the celebration. All of our organizations came together to honor our Blessed Mother and to praise her Divine Son, Jesus Christ, present in the Eucharist.

Today, Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the birthday of the Catholic Church, when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Apostles and our Lady. The Catechism teaches us that, "The moral life of Christians is sustained by the gifts of the Holy Spirit." (CCC 1830) The Catechism goes on to say that, "The fruits of the Spirit are perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the fruits of eternal glory." (CCC 1832) I'll leave it to you to look them up. The one virtue I will mention is *Modesty*. It is defined as moderation in one's personal life, in habits, attitudes, speech, *DRESS*, etc. "The virtue has a certain relativity depending on place, time, and circumstance. Dress suitable for...the beach would not be suitable for church." (The Maryknoll Catholic Dictionary). As we enter the summer months and hot weather, I hope everyone will dress modestly for Mass in respect for our Lord and our fellow parishioners. We run from our air-conditioned houses, into our air-conditioned cars, and into an air-conditioned church. Certainly we can be attired respectfully.

As priests we are required to live celibate lives. In order to do this we need God's grace and to pray that we remain faithful to our promises to God. We also need to be careful of what we watch and read. It is very sad when the greatest temptation we face comes from people coming to Mass and Holy Communion who are dressed immodestly. Certainly we can't expect our youth to embrace decent values when their parents give them a bad example or allow them to wear provocative and improper dress, no matter what the fashion of the day is. Many young people were martyred for the sake of purity. The Church, especially Mass, shouldn't be a place for temptation or scandal. Let us keep God's house a house of prayer.
