Pastor* 

We have entered the joyful Easter season that lasts until Pentecost Sunday which is the commemoration of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles and our Lady fifty days--Pentecost means "50"--after Jesus arose from the dead. I would like to take this opportunity to **thank everyone** who worked so hard to make our church and the liturgy so dignified and beautiful. I hope that those who came to Mass on Easter will continue to attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass every Sunday and Holy Day. Please invite your friends and relatives to attend here or at their own parishes.

In 1931, the Polish nun, Sister Faustina, saw a vision of our Lord with red and white rays coming from His heart. These rays signified the mercy that flows from Jesus' heart. Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina and declared the Second Sunday of Easter (which we celebrate today), "Divine Mercy Sunday" as a reminder that the mercy of God, won for us by Jesus on the cross, is always available to us. All we need do is ask. We have the beautiful practice at St. Columbanus of having a Traditional Latin Mass with the Divine Mercy devotions today at 3:00PM, the time of our Lord's passion. Please join us in honoring our risen Lord and asking for His divine mercy.

Please help us reach our goal for the Cardinal's Appeal. I came across a sermon by Leo the Great. In part he said, "Though all of our means may not be the same, our piety in giving should be. Indeed, the generosity of believers is not measured by the import of the gift, but by the benevolence involved. Therefore, even the poor should offer a contribution to this exchange of mercy, sacrificing something from their earnings—however meager—that will not cause them great sadness, in order to sustain those in need. The wealthy should give more abundantly, but the spirit of the poor should be no less generous. Indeed, as much as it is hoped to harvest more after planting more seed, it may be that a smaller number of seeds provide many more fruits of justice. Our judge [Jesus] is just and true and does not defraud anyone of the reward for his merits. He wants us to take care of the poor for this reason, so that as Christ our God determines our future recompense, He can pour out His promised mercy on those who are merciful."
